Subj: INTRODUCTION OF IONIZING RADIATION MEDICAL EXAMINATION FORM

1. Purpose. To implement the new radiation medical examination form, NAVMED 6470/13, Ionizing Radiation Medical Examination (Rev. 4-2003).

2. Cancellation. BUMEDNOTE 6470 dated 18 Dec 2002 and NAVMED 6470/13 (11-2002) (Test Form).

3. Background

a. Reference (a) directed Navy medical departments to document physical examinations on DD Form 2807-1, Report of Medical History, DD Form 2807-2, Medical Prescreen of Medical History Report, and DD Form 2808, Report of Medical Examination, in lieu of the SF 88, Report of Medical Examination and SF 93, Report of Medical History.

b. Exception was granted for special medical examinations for ionizing radiation, radiation health, aviation medicine, and undersea medicine. These examinations continued to be documented on the Report of Medical Examination (SF 88) and Report of Medical History (SF 93) until replaced with analogous forms.

c. Per references (b) and (c), an analogous radiation examination form, NAVMED 6470/13 (11-2002) (Test Form), was developed and field-tested at representative activities in USS TENNESSEE (SSBN 734), USS T. ROOSEVELT (CVN 71), Norfolk Naval Shipyard, and Recruit Training Command, Great Lakes.

d. NAVMED 6470/13 (Rev. 4-2003) combines both the critical elements of the medical examination and medical history evaluation. Radiation medical examination standards are unique

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only to the Navy; therefore, Navy will use the NAVMED 6470/13 specifically for Navy and Marine Corps active duty and DOD employees' radiation medical examinations.

e. The standards for a radiation medical examination, as specified in reference (d), will continue to apply. If a radiation medical examination is conducted in conjunction with other medical examinations, NAVMED 6470/13 (4-2003) shall be attached as an addendum to the DD Form 2807-1 and DD Form 2808, or the SF 88 and SF 93.

4. Action. Effective immediately, NAVMED 6470/13 (4-2003) shall be used in lieu of the SF 88 and SF 93 for documenting radiation medical examinations.
